International Students: Key Points

- International students discover Cottey through referrals, self-initiated inquiries and applications (finding Cottey on the internet)
- International applicants require additional steps to be admitted to Cottey
- Once accepted, students complete paperwork, submit a tuition deposit, register for classes and go through the I-20 and visa process



International Students: Key Points continued

- International financial aid requires a CSS profile (like the FAFSA for international students), and a certification of finances
- International students may be eligible for merit, athletic, fine arts, and P.E.O. scholarships, as well as need-based grants and campus employment

- Canadian students pay tuition with Canadian dollars
 - The difference is covered through the Cottey Canadian grant
- Cottey offers support prearrival and on-campus support to students

Arrival: Orientation

- Shuttle from MCI airport

- Health insurance plans





After Arrival

- Take them to Social Security Office
- Help them open bank accounts
- Help them understand cell phone plans / options
- Help them fill out employment documents, direct deposit
- Help them with medical immunizations, TB tests, etc.
- Share information on driver's licenses

- A few local host families willing to host






Support-A-Student
