ELIGIBILITY

Applicants can be any academic year, but must be baccalaureate-seeking and have a 2.50 cumulative grade point average. Selected students must clear their absence on October 28 with their professors, teams, and work supervisors.

Travel, museum entry, and meal costs for the Dividing Lines Immersion are provided by the Serenbetz Institute. Students may wish to bring spending money to pay for incidental expenses (souvenirs, snacks, etc.).
