

The class took a guided tour of the town that focused on the places Cather wrote about in her prairie trilogy (*O Pioneers!, The Song of the Lark,* and *My Antonia*); spent an afternoon exploring and writing on the prairie; witnessed the sunrise, sunset, and full moon on the prairie; and stayed in the Cather Second Home (with one lucky student getting to sleep in Willa Cather's actual bedroom!). The group also made a quick stop at the "geographical center of the lower 48 states" on the way back to Nevada.
