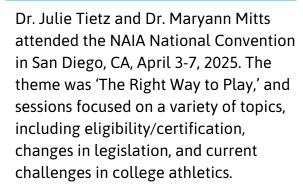

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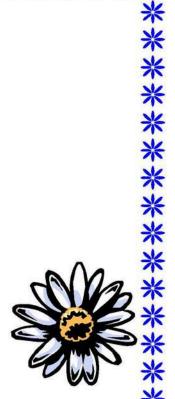

As travel needs begin to increase and more vehicles are being used, this is a friendly reminder that reserving a college vehicle is a two-step process.

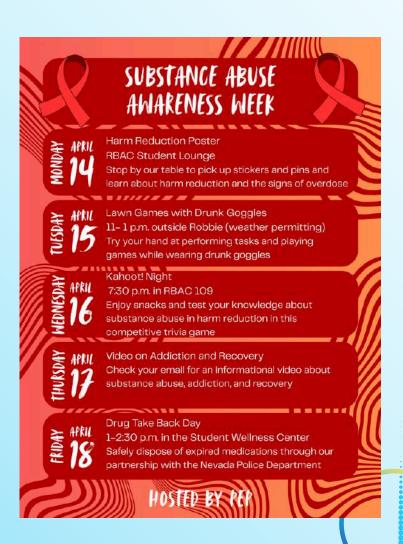
- 1. Please go into Event Manager (EvM) and fill out a reservation for the vehicle you need. Using this tool will let you see what vehicles are available on the day you need to travel. Please note that if it is a trip for more than one day you need to choose the multiple-day options so that the reservation shows up correctly on the calendar. Vehicles are reserved on a first come, first served basis so please plan ahead as much as possible.
- 2. Once you have secured the vehicle in EvM please fill out the Travel Authorization and check the appropriate person for approval. This is needed for billing and approval purposes. You will find this on the MyCottey site in the Employee tab under Forms. Just click on it and input your information, insuring the same vehicle is on both. Please note you will not get a confirmation in EVM until a matching Travel Authorization has been submitted and approved.

On March 31st and April 7th, Cottey College hosted Credit as an Asset 101, a dynamic workshop presented by Tiffany Anderson with New Growth. The event was a collaborative effort between the Clark Institute for Women in Business and Cottey's Career Services, with support from Beth Reeves. Designed to empower students with foundational financial knowledge, the workshop focused on understanding and using credit wisely.

Anderson engaged the audience with real-life insights and practical strategies for building and maintaining good credit. One attendee noted, "I learned the importance of choosing the right credit card—and once you have it, keep it low and keep it up." Another commented, "Very informative. I learned why I should use each of my credit cards each month."

Feedback from the post-event exit survey reflected the impact of the workshop. All respondents (100%) reported learning something new, felt the information was clearly presented, and expressed greater confidence in managing their credit. When asked what they found most helpful, participants mentioned learning how credit scores work, the steps to improve credit, and the real-world examples Tiffany shared.

Thanks to the collaboration between campus departments and the engaging guidance of Tiffany Anderson, Credit as an Asset 101 proved to be both informative and empowering—setting students on a path toward financial confidence and smart credit use.
