WHAT IS DELIVERY?

- Delivery is the verbal conveyance of text, such as in a presentation, speech, or debate
- Delivery has its origins in Greek and Roman oratory—
 the art of public speaking
- It involves the use of the voice and body in presenting

WHAT ARE THE FEATURES OF DELIVERY?

Vocal features:

- -Volume
- -Tempo/rate
- -Intonation

Kinesics features:

- -Gestures
- -Eye contact
- -Movement

VOCAL FEATURES

- Volume: how loudly or quietly one speaks
 - Should be heard by all audience members without screaming
- Tempo/rate: how quickly or slowly one speaks
 - Should be generally balanced
- Intonation: the rise and fall of the voice
 - Too little is monotone; too much is nerve-wracking

- All of these can (and should) be adjusted in places to add emphasis
 - Practice the art of "tension and release"

KINESICS FEATURES

- Gestures: use of the hands
 - Can be used to add interest and indicate enthusiasm...within reason
 - Be mindful of different gestures' cultural significance
- Eye contact: looking directly at (not above) members of the audience
 - Should be balanced across all audience members
- Movement: the speaker's motion across the stage/speaking area
 - Not too much, not too little
 - Should be done deliberately, not randomly

PRESENTING IN GROUPS

- Practicing as a group—in person—is essential
- Have clearly-defined speaking roles planned out
 - Members should talk about sections they are most comfortable with
- Provide smooth transitions between speakers
 - "And now [name] is going to talk about..."

- Don't stand in front of your visual aid!
- Acquaint yourself with the speaking location in advance
- Remember that elite delivery takes years of practice
