






Jordan Johnson

Jordan Johnson's article, "Angelina in the Archives: Tracing Heteropatriarchy and Settler Colonialism in Local Histories of the Pineywoods" is now available through *Frontiers: A Journal of Women Studies*

The article examines early modern colonial accounts alongside more contemporary paintings, murals, and narratives to understand the role of a Caddo woman known as Angelina within settler discourses of place and belonging, demonstrating how settler storytelling practices comprehend Angelina according to heteropatriarchal norms of gender and sexuality while framing colonization within a teleological narrative of US history.
